Welcome to our Autumn newsletter 2023. It has been a summer of progress and development at Tarporley War Memorial Hospital, since its transition in 2022 when the Trustees cemented a partnership with the Countess of Chester Hospital Trust (CoCH). Here are some of the highlights.

Services & Facilities at TWMH



We are proud to report that TWMH has been welcoming and treating patients using the new facilities for most of this year. The list of services continues to grow, and community feedback is extremely positive. A reminder of the services now available:

- Ultrasound
- Physiotherapy
- Children's therapy team
- Neurotherapy team (see spotlight)
- Podiatry, doppler, leg ulcer and dressing clinics
- Community midwives' and health visitor open advice clinics
- Diabetes education group
- GP minor surgeries
- AAA (abdominal aortic aneurysm) screening
- Private counselling/therapy services
- Autism and ADHD assessments
- Pelvic floor clinics
- Rapid Response and Hospital at Home

Spotlight on: Neurotherapy Services

"The Neurotherapy Team provides rehabilitation to patients with neurological conditions, including stroke and longer-term conditions such as Multiple Sclerosis and Parkinson's Disease. As well as being an out-patient facility for patients to attend both individual 1:1 treatment sessions and group activities, the hospital is also used as a base for staff who then carry out home visits to patients in the surrounding areas. The TWMH Charitable Trust has provided additional funding for specialist equipment to enhance this important service and more is planned.

We currently run several groups at TWMH including Parkinson's Disease Class, Fatigue Management and Pilates. Plans to expand include Strength & Balance Class, Multiple Sclerosis Class and Upper Limb Class.

Additionally, next year we plan to introduce gardening groups where patients can relearn movement and balance through gardening. We also have plans to collaborate with the Stroke Association to run some information groups in the future. We look forward to seeing more and more community facilities for all ages in the new year."

Working closely with our Community



We are working in partnership with stakeholders to utilise our hospital facilities for the benefit of our community. Our local first responders from the North West Ambulance Service now have space within the hospital to store equipment, and are working with us to promote training to develop critical skills within the community. A fantastic example of this has been the delivery of free CPR training at TWMH throughout the summer months. Since July, 166 local people have already received this invaluable training and additional sessions will be held throughout the winter months. Further initiatives planned (subject to demand) include: partnering with Cardiac Risk in the Young (CRY) to deliver free screening sessions; and working with the Alzheimer’s Society to develop ‘Dementia Friendly Tarporley’.

We were pleased to fund the refurbishment of the Campbell room this summer, creating a comfortable and welcoming space for counselling sessions. The room is dedicated to the Campbell family in recognition of their support and commitment to TWMH over several generations.
